

We use 'had' when we talk about yesterday (past).

For example:

- ✓ Bhola **had** a parrot last year, but it flew away.
- The school **had** many outdoor games.
- I **had** a little money.
- Meenu **had** high fever.
- Kamal **had** a beautiful pair of shoes. Has he lost them?
- The school **had** a competition last Sunday.



Has/have/had are also used to show that an action has been completed.

For example

- He **has** finished his work.
- We **have** visited the temple in the morning.
- Mani **has** played cricket.
- George **has** gone to school.
- Puja **had** cooked the food yesterday.
- Suzane and Prateek **have** recited the poem.
- Adam **had** taken his breakfast.
- Kundan **has** prepared his lesson.



### Remember

We use 'have', 'has' to show that an action has been done recently. Example, Raju has sung a song a short while ago.

But when the action was done long before we use 'had.' Example, yesterday, day before yesterday and so on.


