- 8. They were walking as in a dream because their land had been destroyed and they had lost all their belongings. They were in a different land, almost
  - starving and weary. The writer tries to emphasize the feeling of helplessness of the refugees.

They were walking as if in a trance, not noticing anything around them. This is why the word 'nothing' has been used in this line twice. This creates the dark and foreboding mood of the story.

- 9. The old man's wisdom guided him to save some silver for the future, in hope that his grandson could plant the seed when he grew up. This tells us that he was wise and selfless, in the hope of a better future.
- 10. The vendor said that had he not been poor, he would have given the bowl of noodles to the old man. But since the old had a bit of silver, he hesitated. This tells us that he was greedy and unkind.
- 11. The author wants the future generation to see what huge responsibility it is overlooking; they must be prepared to carry on the hard work of the previous generation and not let it go to waste.
